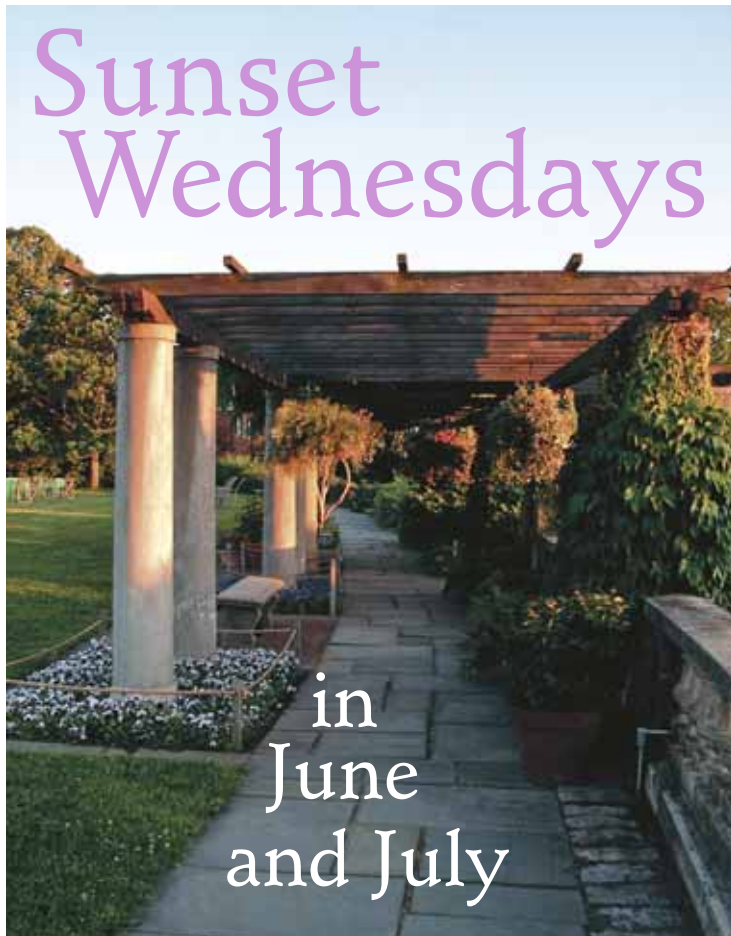

In Memoriam... Wave Hill shares the sad news of the passing of **Peter Hans Sauer**, writer, educator and administrator, and Executive Director of Wave Hill from 1979 to 1990. Peter was instrumental in crafting a vision for Wave Hill that led to its prominence as model for the use of public land. Prior to coming to Wave Hill he was part of the team at the Bank Street College of

Education that developed the ideas that led to the formation of the Head Start Program. In addition, he was associate editor and a board member of *Orion Magazine*. His legacy is honored at Wave Hill in our mission, which continues to celebrate garden, landscape and views, and in our programs, which help all of us connect in profound ways with the natural world around us.

Family Art Project

Rolling Out the River/ Descubriendo el río
SAT, SUN, JUNE 6, 7
Sketch Wave Hill's expansive Hudson River vistas. Then put your colorful river views and visions into a portable panoramic paper movie scroll.

Unfolding Trees of Imagination/ Arboles de la imaginación
SAT, SUN, JUNE 13, 14
Inspired by Geoffrey Jones' video *A Tree Lives*, based on Noah Baen's art work and a poem by Richard Lewis, collage a vision of the tree within you.

A Nest for Daddy/Un nido para papá
SAT, SUN, JUNE 20, 21
Find inspiration in Janelle Iglesias' Sunroom Project in Glynor Gallery, based on the elaborate nests that papa bower birds build.

Shadow Play in the Forest/ Juego de sombras en el bosque

See Jorge Crespo's rainforest version of *The Ant and the Grasshopper* for shadow puppets. Then make your own forest shadow puppet play.

Spray a River Garden/ Jardines de acuarías

Combine mists of watercolor and blossoms fashioned from color-soaked coffee filters into a blooming summer vision painted without a brush.

Waving on the Hill/ Creando ondas con una bandera
SAT, SUN, JULY 11, 12
Observe and make waves—those repeating patterns of energy—large and small, in liquids and solids. Then make a flag for a wavy-world parade.

A Roomful of River/ Un cuarto lleno de agua
SAT, SUN, JULY 18, 19
Bring the Hudson inside. Furnish a miniature room for a river-dwelling inhabitant. Use natural imagery and materials and modeling clay.

A Tiny Village among the Trees/ Una pequeña villa entre los árboles
SAT, SUN, JULY 25, 26
In a secluded thicket among friendly trees, fashion sticks, string, leaves and bark into a tiny fairy-sized dwelling.

T-Shirt with Trees/ Arboles y camisetas
SAT, SUN, AUGUST 1, 2
Sketch your favorite Wave Hill tree and the river vista behind it. Use fabric markers and special crayons to put your vision on a t-shirt you can wear.

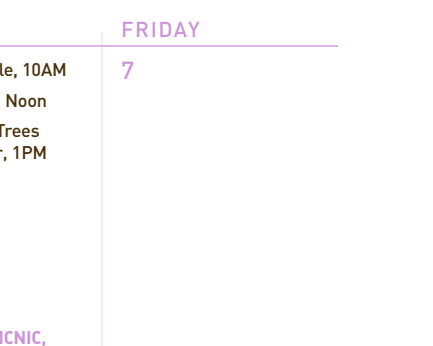
Water, Water Everywhere/ Agua, agua en todas partes

Wave Hill Members can now enjoy NYC Audubon Members rates at the birding organization's events, thanks to a new partnership starting this summer when Audubon Executive Director **Glenn Phillips** joins walk leader and naturalist **Gabriel Willow** for the first birding walk of the season. 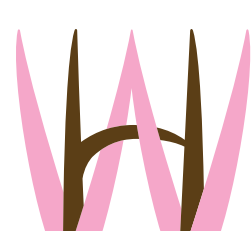

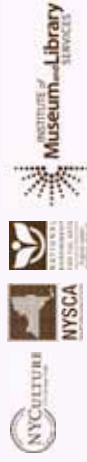
