## **Wave Hill Garden Gala Honors Kate French's Tenure**

Bronx, NY, May 6, 2008 — On Thursday, May 29, 2008, Wave Hill, an internationally acclaimed public garden and cultural center, hosts its annual Spring Garden Gala. This year Wave Hill honors Kate French, who served with distinction as Wave Hill's Executive Director for 17 years. The festive party brings together 250 Wave Hill enthusiasts for a delightful evening of **cocktails-at-sunset, dinner, and entertainment**. Guests will enjoy dinner by **Great Performances** in a decorated party tent on the Lower Lawn.

During Ms. French's tenure, Wave Hill has emerged as a vibrant and welcoming urban destination, with lively, contemporary programming in horticulture, education and the arts amid a spectacular, world-renowned garden landscape. Visitor services also advanced, including the establishment of a café and catering food services, expansion of the gift shop and the creation of tour and event business to generate earned income. Capital improvements, including renovation of Glyndor House and development of the Perkins Visitor Center, have dramatically opened public access to Wave Hill facilities and increased compliance with the *Americans with Disabilities Act*. Wave Hill's first endowment campaign, undertaken in the 1990s, has become a cornerstone of support for the institution. Today, Wave Hill maintains a \$6 million annual operating budget, sustained by a \$20 million endowment.
