SUNSET WEDNESDAYS AT WAVE HILL

Herb Gardening in **June**, Mid-Summer Music in **July**

On Wednesday evenings in June and July, Wave Hill is open until 9pm for visitors to enjoy horticulture and arts programming; the twilight garden and Hudson River sunsets; and art exhibitions in the gallery and outdoors. IN JUNE, ‘The Aromatic and Edible Garden’ series offers a perfect primer on the aesthetic, culinary and cultural aspects of growing herbs. IN JULY, take pleasure in garden performances featuring Himalayan singing bowls, Brazilian bossa nova, and Puerto Rican rhythms at Mid-Summer Music. Beginning June 11, artist Nina Katchadourian’s transliterated birdcalls emanate from the trees; in Glyndor Gallery, 15 artists exhibit their spirited “Garden Improvements.”

Programs begin at 6:30PM, and are free with admission to grounds, \$4/\$2 senior, student.

Garden interpretation experts Laurel Rimmer and Charles Day discuss **lemon-scented herbs, basils, *Alliums*, and scented geraniums**—four ornamental and delicious Wave Hill favorites. Learn how to grow both common and unusual varieties in containers and in the ground. Then explore Wave Hill’s ornamental herbs on a self-guided garden tour. JUNE 7 Lemon-Scented Herbs

Pucker-up for recipes flavored with the zesty essence of lemon thyme, lemon verbena, and lemon grass.

JUNE 14 Bountiful Basils

Sniff and sample cinnamon, lemon, and Thai basil and other unusual, easy-to-grow cultivars in delicious summer dishes. ✨ Meet *Garden Improvement* artists **Marguerite Kahrl and Paul Ruff** and their solar-powered lawn mower, 7:15pm.

JUNE 21 Essential *Alliums*

Discover the beauty and diversity of ornamental onions and sample their edible kin—garlic, chives, and leeks—in savory recipes. ✨ Meet *Garden Improvement* artist **Phil Ross**; learn about his experimental work with plants, 7:15pm.

JUNE 28 Scented Geranium Sampler

Revel in the scent of rose, peppermint and lemon, and enjoy delectable dishes cooked with these aromatic *Pelargoniums*. ✨ Meet *Garden Improvement* artist **Charles Goldman** and his portable solar-powered fountain, 7:15pm.

JULY 5 Cilla Vee Movement Project

Watch "motion sculptors" move through the gardens like flowers drawing energy from the earth. *Spirits Soaring* is a site-specific performance featuring Ladonna Smith – violin, Rachel Schlafer-Parton – flute, Janet Barratt – voice, Mark G Lamb – dance, Meg Brooker – dance, Claire Elizabeth Barratt - dance/choreography. ✨ Tour the Flower Garden's old-fashioned larkspur, hollyhocks and hydrangeas, 6:30pm.

JULY 12 Yukijurushi

Unwind with subtly hypnotic rhythms and haunting melodies of modern Brazilian folk music performed by Tatsuya Nakatani (drums and vocals), Todd Nicholson (bass), and Eiji Obata (guitar). ✨ Tour the Wild Garden's towering perennials and colorful combinations, 6:30pm.

JULY 19 Yerbabuena

Tap into the core of Puerto Rican and Caribbean culture with a collective of musicians, singers and dancers who share their passion for the traditional rhythms of plena, bomba and musica jíbara. Directed by Tato Torres. ✨ Tour the Herb Garden's delightful scents and herbal splendor, 6:30pm.

JULY 26 Pulse Field

Travel to realms of healing, creativity and insight with this blend of ancient world music performed on Himalayan singing bowls and other earthy instruments. ✨ Tour the Monocot and Aquatic Gardens' oasis of bold tropical plants, 6:30pm.
