Celebrate the
Hudson!

This fall, Wave Hill celebrates the 400th anniversary of Captain Henry Hudson's voyage up the river that now bears his name. Dynamic programs prompt a fresh view of this majestic, 315-mile waterway that connects the Adirondack Mountains to Upper New York Bay.

Start at the entrance to the gardens, where sweeping views of the river and the Palisades help define each visit to Wave Hill. Extend the outdoor experience with a special **river-related walk**, or a session of **Tai Chi** or **Yoga** on the lawns. Enjoy special, river-themed **Family Art Projects** and **birding walks**. Come indoors to savor **historic concerts** that recreate performances along the Hudson, and a **book-discussion series** focused on the settling of the river valley. In **Glyndor Gallery** and on the grounds, contemporary artists explore the First Nations' engagement with the river and the impact of Hudson's arrival.

Honey Weekend and **openhousenewyork** weekend, as well as special events and exciting new merchandise in The Shop at Wave Hill and tasty menus in the Café, provide seasonal highlights to enhance the celebration. Visit us often to pay homage to the mighty Hudson and share with us the glories of autumn in the gardens.

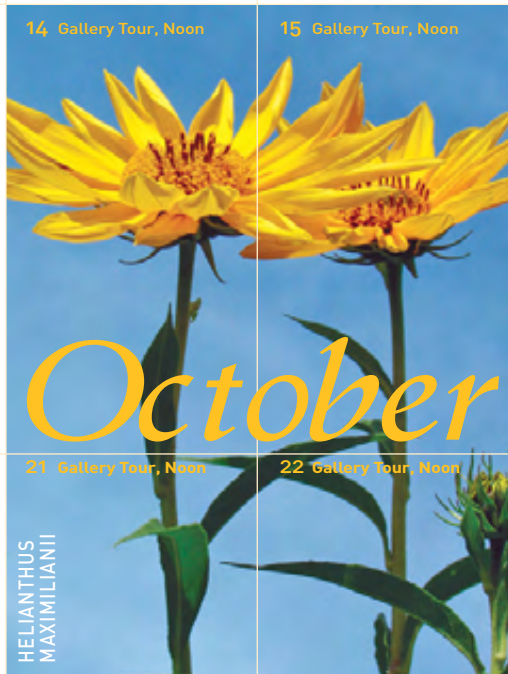

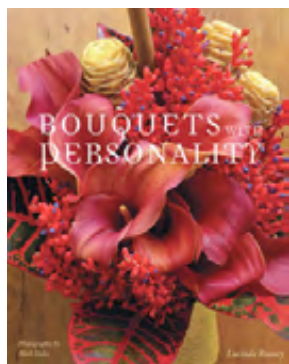
