Autumn Abundance at Wave Hill

Bronx, NY, July 23, 2008 – Go local this fall with a cool getaway to Wave Hill, a public garden and cultural center overlooking the Hudson River and Palisades. Enjoy **beekeeping**, **birding** and **garden walks** and **cooking demonstrations**. Sign up for workshops on **nature photography** and **pastel art**. Take in a collaborative **photography exhibition** exploring the natural spaces of the Bronx. Purchase tickets to the **2008-2009 Concert Season** of Jazz, Classical, Cabaret and New Perspectives, a series devoted to emerging artists. The season opens with Blue Notes on Sunday, September 21. New this fall are **Sunday Brunches**, served in Wave Hill House's Large Gallery, once the formal dining room and a favorite of Mark Twain, who made his home here a century ago. Sunday Brunches feature organic produce from Katchkie Farm, a project of Wave Hill's exclusive caterer Great Performances.

Getting here is easy. A free Wave Hill shuttle meets Metro-North trains at the Riverdale station – a 25-minute ride from Grand Central Terminal – and picks up passengers at the terminus of the #1 subway at W. 242 Street. Check wavehill.org for shuttle schedules and pick-up/drop-off points for train and subway. Coming by car? Park free offsite. Limited onsite parking.

Come often this fall, to share, relax and delight in the abundance of the natural world.
