Two special weekends, in early October and in early November, invite visitors of all ages to explore these tiny subjects.

It is also a memorable season: Wave Hill's observation of the tenth anniversary of 9/11 offers visitors a time and place for reflection and remembrance. The Friendly Falcons and Their Friend the Snake

SEPTEMBER 13–OCTOBER 16

Artists **Jeffrey Kurosaki** and **Tara Pelletier**, also known as **The Friendly Falcons and Their Friend the Snake**, transform the Sunroom into a set/installation for a project called *Songs to Plants* that explores the humanization of the natural environment. Drawing from what the artists deem as "life's magnificent and miniature grandeurs," they build multi-layered stories that express universal emotions, such as love, violence, loss and sadness. This is achieved through musical narration and stylized sculptural forms initiated during their recent Winter Workspace residency at Wave Hill.

Caitlin Parker

Caitlin Parker built a scale model of the Sunroom and placed it in Wave Hill's Woodlands from March to August. Two motion-sensor cameras recorded the comings and goings of various fauna that live here, as well as any changes to the flora over that time. She edited the photographic stills into a time-lapse video that is displayed with the weathered and decayed model serving as a witness to the unseen changes in the landscape. Sreshta Rit Premnath

Sreshta Rit Premnath continues his "Pillbox" series, exploring the issue of pharmaceutical companies' patenting genes of indigenous medicinal plants from India and other developing countries. Referring to the small box in which one may carry medicines, as well as a partly underground fort used as a military outpost, Premnath creates a pillbox containing a miniature garden of plants that are being contested by various "biopiracy" taskforces around the world.

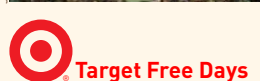

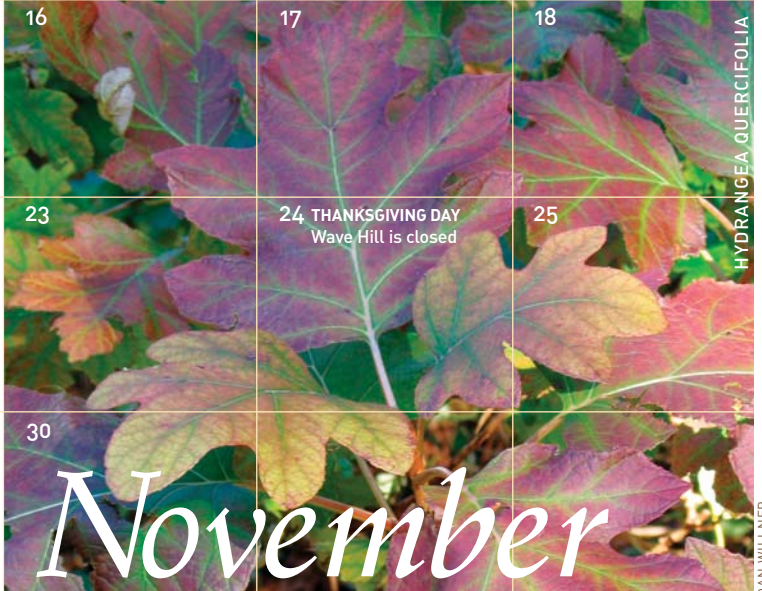
