Explore Spring Gardens

Twenty-eight acres of gardens and woodland green up as leaves unfurl and perennials emerge. Spring at Wave Hill begins symbolically with an explosion of glory-of-the-snow flowers in the Herbert & Hyonja Abrons Woodland. Flowering trees and a succession of bulb plantings and wildflowers carry the garden through spring. Find tulips in seasonal beds like the (5) Pergola, (8) Paisley Bed and (22) Kate French Terrace. **To learn more, join a free Garden Highlights Walk on Sunday afternoons.**

- 1 FRONT ENTRANCE** The entrance to Wave Hill offers a fresh perspective. Swaths of low-growing foliage plants mirror the permeable pathway. Flowering trees shower visitors with pink, white and yellow blossoms in April.
- 2 HERBERT & HYONJA ABRONS WOODLAND**
A 1/2-mile trail ambles along wooded slopes.
- 6 FLOWER GARDEN** This English cottage-style garden features unique cultivars and relatives of spring classics like allium, peony, clematis, geranium and iris.
- 7 MARCO POLO STUFANO CONSERVATORY**
In early spring, aloes and South African bulbs are at their peak.

Wave Hill House & Café

Wave Hill House is the hub for public programs indoors, including the Family Art Project. Nature-themed artworks also on view.

Glyndor Gallery

- 13 T.H. EVERETT ALPINE HOUSE** A succession of dynamic blooms keep this House and surrounding terrace intriguing year-round. Every month, a new plant will be highlighted via an audio guide.
- 14 GOLD BORDER** Winter aconite, daffodils and other warm-hued plants emphasize the sun's golden light.
- 16 WILD GARDEN** An early-spring highlight, this hillside garden features small spring flowers, like crocus, dwarf iris, species tulips and pinks, tucked into every crevice.
- 19 SHADE BORDER** This intimate woodland-setting is filled with native and Asian species that favor low light. Trillium and other spring ephemerals will bloom for a short period before trees leaf out.
- 20 CONIFER SLOPE** The cone-bearing trees in this fine collection were selected for their attractive habits and interesting foliage. Every spring, the trees' cones swell and burst with pollen; pollination is aided by wind.
- 26 ELLIPTICAL GARDEN** A formal, native-plant garden set into the stonework of a former swimming pool. May features include colorful mossy and woodland phlox.



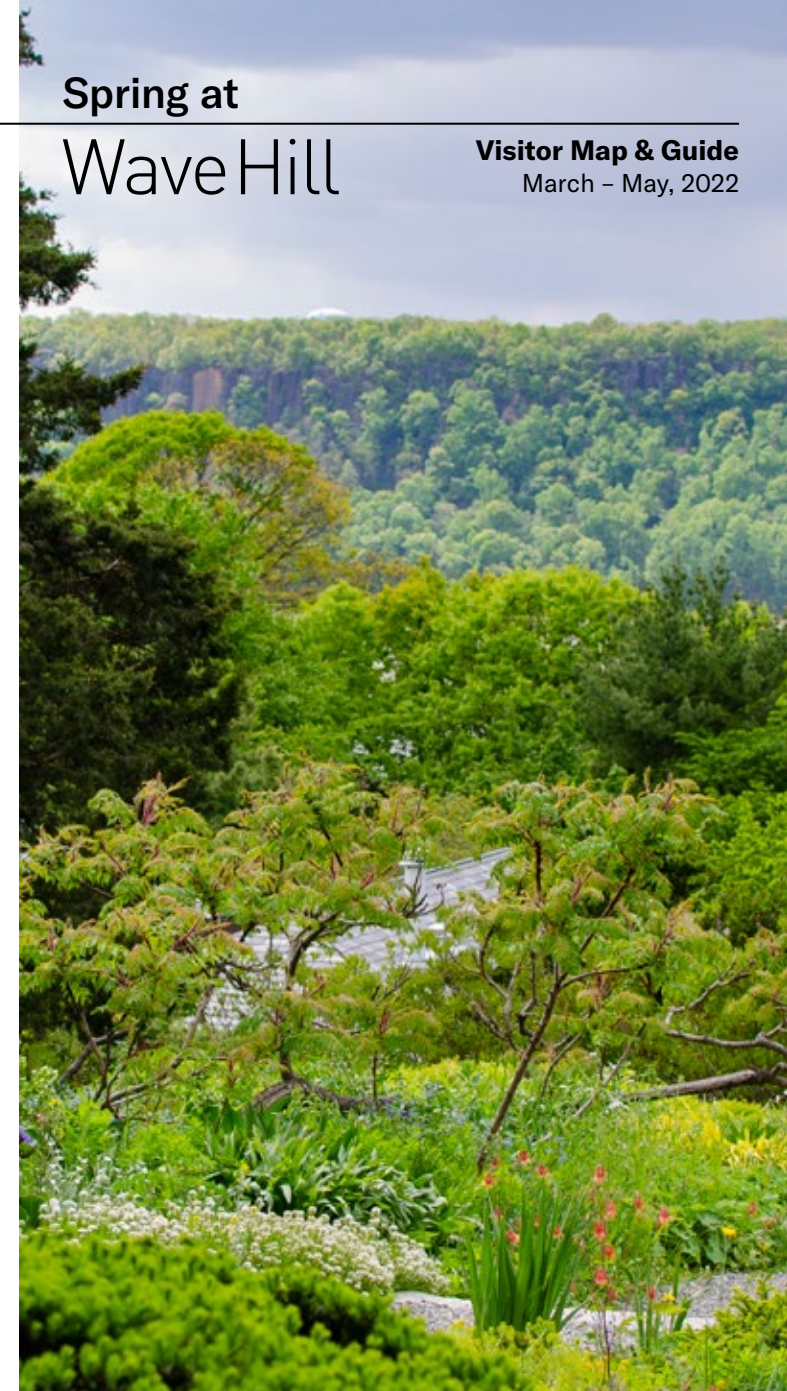

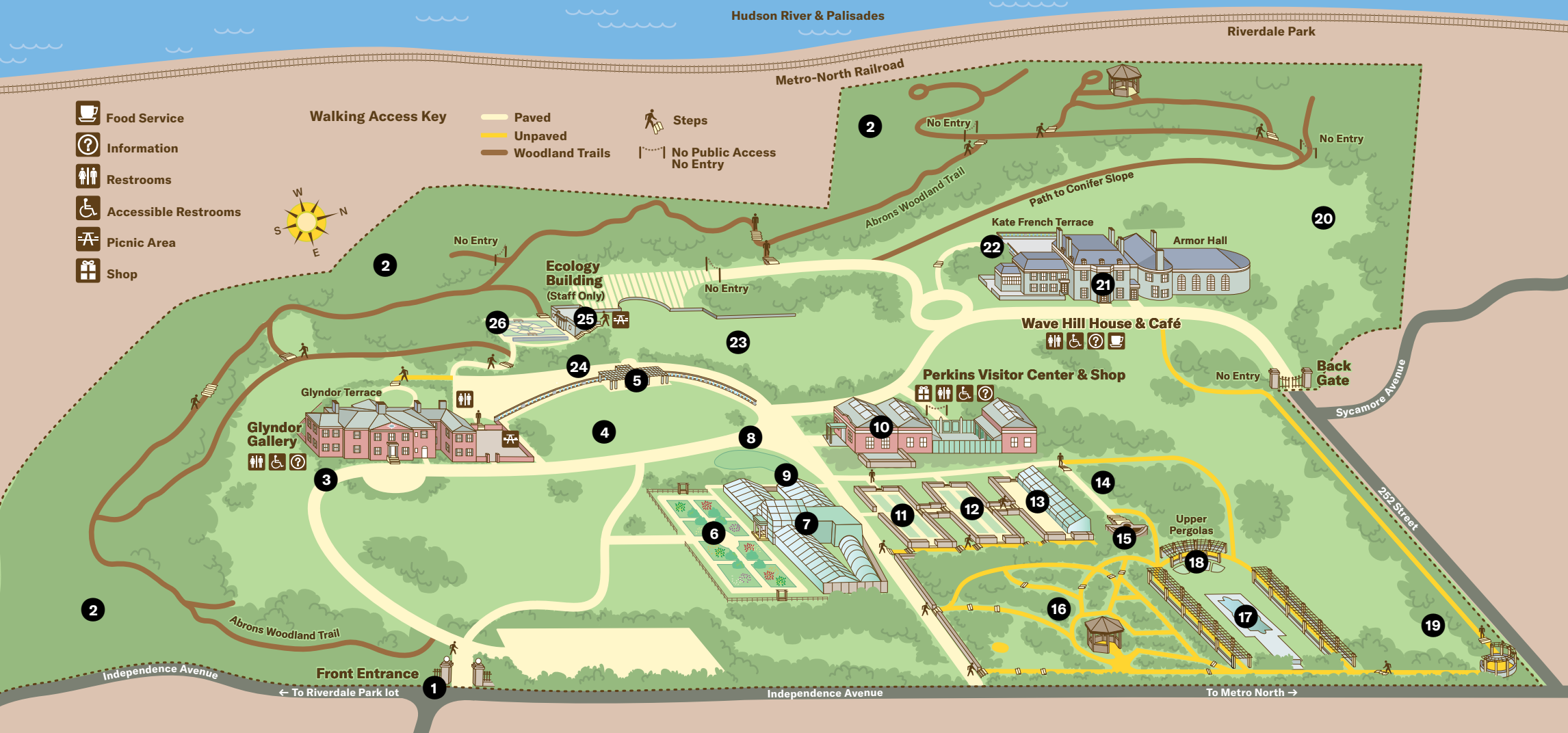
