Explore Winter Gardens

Twenty-eight acres of magnificent trees, spectacular views and a cozy indoor conservatory beckon visitors to Wave Hill in the winter. Not entirely asleep, the garden is filled with life during this cold season. There is much to see if you know where to look: winter birds play in the grass and under plants, evergreen trees and shrubs get their time to shine and our multi-room conservatory features plants from warmer climates. **To learn more, join a free Garden Highlights Walk on Sundays at 2:00PM.**

- **3 GLYNDOR GALLERY** Surrounding the entrance, broadleaf evergreens glisten as their wax-like leaves reflect the winter sun. Aromatic sweet box and paper bush plants bloom in late winter.
- 6 **FLOWER GARDEN** Accentuated by snowfall, the structures here—living and not—stand out against the landscape and the bright, winter-blue sky above.
- 7 MARCO POLO STUFANO CONSERVATORY Winter highlights include South African bulbs in the Palm House, aloes in the Cactus and Succulent House and orchids in the Tropical House.
- 8 **PAISLEY BED** A holiday installation up until early January, *Wildlife Trees* features natural and edible ornaments for birds.

MEMBERSHIP Join today...and your admission is free! Bring your front entrance receipt to the Perkins Visitor Center and sign up today.

- **10 PERKINS VISITOR CENTER** Drawn to its shrub collection, full of fruit and seed, birds populate this thoroughfare. In mid-winter, Asian witch hazels begin to bloom.
- **13 T.H. EVERETT ALPINE HOUSE** Diminutive plants bloom throughout winter. After a fresh storm, gardeners place snow on certain plants to break dormancy.
- **16 WILD GARDEN** Step inside the gazebo, and look out for a glimpse of winter blooming flowers, such as snowdrops and hellebores.
- 20 CONIFER SLOPE Evergreen and cone-producing trees make up this diverse collection. As you make your way down the hill, stop to touch and examine leaves and cones. Complex shapes and patterns await!
- 21 WAVE HILL HOUSE Mantles and fireplaces are adorned with Wave Hill-grown greens and natural materials foraged from the garden up until early January. Warm up inside Armor Hall, which happens to offer a great view of the birdfeeders.
- **23 LOWER LAWN** Set against the cold backdrop of winter, warm-hued branches of shrubby dogwoods appear to be ablaze.


